Road & Bridge:

Bid for cutter estimated at \$19433.00. A 1-year lease for a different vehicle --tractor-- would cost \$8.00/hr. Vote for estimate on cutter was made, with two votes of aye from Commissioners Kliethermes and Dudenhoeffer, and one vote of nay from Commissioner Glavin on July 12, 2018. No vote for tractor was made.

Sheriff:

Sheriff Bonham updated Commission meeting that many warrant arrests were being made, currently. Sheriff Bonham requested that Commissioners consider a budget for fencing in area below courthouse to pen in and better secure department's equipment and storage. Commissioners indicated that a budget for such is already on the table, they are just being held up by the large amount of wells present in the desired area.

Bomb threat received on Tuesday, July 10, 2018, on County Road 621. Sheriff Bonham had road closed, out of caution that object could be an IED (improvised explosive device), located on roadside.
